Important information about Indigenous Self-Identification


- The information you submit when you apply to UBC will automatically be added to your Workday profile.
- Self-identification information can only be viewed by certain UBC staff.
- The Indigenous Self-Identification is only visible on Workday for students who are Canadian citizens.
- If you are not a Canadian citizen, you must contact [Enrolment Services](#) to update your information.

How to edit your Indigenous Self-Identification

First, go to your profile in Workday

1. Log into your Workday account at myworkday.ubc.ca.
2. On the Workday home screen, click your user icon in the top right corner.
3. Click the "View Profile" button in the pop up menu.

At UBC, we are transitioning to the internationally-preferred term “Indigenous” to refer inclusively to status and non-status First Nations, Métis and Inuit peoples of Canada, in accordance with the BC Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act (DRIPA), which defines “Indigenous peoples” as aboriginal peoples under section 35(2) of the Constitution Act, 1982. The term “Aboriginal” appears below in the self-identification questions to ensure consistency with the BC Aboriginal Data Standard.

UBC recognizes this terminology may not be reflective of how Indigenous individuals and communities prefer to identify themselves. Students are welcome to identify their Band / Nation / Community / Métis Settlement / Inuit Treaty Area below.

If you answer “yes” below, you may be asked to provide supporting documents to verify your answer. If you knowingly or carelessly provide untrue information in response to this question, UBC may, in its sole discretion, do any or all of the following: (a) withdraw your offer of admission, (b) require you to withdraw from UBC, and (c) subject you to academic or non-academic discipline.
